# WHY Contextual Research?:

What is WHAT, HOW, WHY and why do we use it in essay writing?

#### Research tasks.

When you begin your KS4 course, you will discover that there are three Assessment Objectives that you must meet in order to succeed. These are:

AO1- How well you answer the exam question and how well you use the text to answer it.

AO2- How well you can analyse the writer's methods for deeper meaning. AO3- The use of contextual information, what has influenced the writer in terms of their own life and the time that they live in.

To know a text well, you must spend time discovering the context of the text. We are asking you to spend some time researching important contextual information for Shakespeare's Macbeth to help your study in Year 10.

# You may use context to eventually write a point such as:


Religion during the Jacobean era is deeply relevant to Macbeth in several ways, reflecting the contemporary concerns and beliefs of Shakespeare's audience. The period was marked by intense religious tension and a profound sense of the supernatural, which is intricately woven into the fabric of the play. Many characters, like those living at the time of writing, are duplicitous and do not portray their true feelings and beliefs.






Research how people felt about religion during the Elizabethan and Jacobean eras and explain the conflict between the Catholics and Protestants.
